SUBJECT: **SJSU Regulated Tools and Equipment, 2025 Annual Report**

The San Jose State University (SJSU) is committed to transparency, communication, and engagement with campus community members. In July 2022, the Board of Trustees approved the system-wide Regulated Tools and Equipment policy recommended by the Chiefs of Police representing the twenty-two University Police Departments. This policy was adopted and published as outlined by Assembly Bill 481 and requires every law enforcement agency in California to publish certain information annually regarding specified equipment.

Information regarding the use, policy compliance, funding, and inventory for the 2025 calendar year to date are outlined below
